Our greatest desire is to help the younger generation develop the right mindset and awareness so that they can change their own lives, support their families, and contribute to their communities.

That is why Be Better Foundation does more than just provide financial support—we walk alongside our students, shaping their thinking, nurturing their character, and instilling a sense of responsibility. ### "CHANGE THE FUTURE" SCHOLARSHIP

Financial assistance covering full tuition (100%), partial tuition (50%), or encouragement support (25%), ensuring that students can continue their education and complete their study; accompanying students throughout their learning path until graduation.



### MENTORSHIP PROGRAM

Sharing real-life experiences and valuable lessons, inspiring and guiding students in their journey toward adulthood.

The foundation's founders and volunteer members, often business owners or experts in various fields, help equip students with knowledge, skills, and experience to navigate in their own path, achieve success and a meaningful life, and contribute to society.



## SOCIAL IMPACT

# OUR FOUNDING STORY



# BE BETTER FOUNDATION

The seed of Be Better Foundation was sown in the early 1980s in Cai Von Town, Binh Minh District (now known as Binh Minh Town), Vinh Long Province, where Mr. Tran Van Tinh, the founder of Be Better Foundation, was born.

Mr. Tinh's parents were among the poorest of the poor. His mother only completed third grade, while his father, despite never formally attending school, managed to learn basic reading and writing by eavesdropping on classes. They mainly made ends meet by manual labor, petty trade, and odd jobs.

When Mr. Tinh was eight years old, his father suffered a devastating fall from a tree, leaving him permanently paralyzed from the waist down. From that moment, he was thrust into the realities of life. The entire family struggled daily just to ensure that Mr. Tinh and his siblings could continue their education. They stayed up late, woke up early, and worked tirelessly from dawn to dusk, yet none of Mr. Tinh's siblings ever had to drop out of school. Moreover, ensuring their children's education and raising them to become virtuous individuals was not just a duty but the lifelong purpose and heartfelt wish of his parents.

Even in their poverty, Mr. Tinh's parents were always willing to help others in need. In 2008, when Mr. Tinh's financial situation improved, he began actively engaging in charitable work alongside his parents. By 2021, during the COVID-19 pandemic, Mr. Tinh deeply reflected on his blessings. He realized that from a child selling lottery tickets and tofu scraps for animal feed, he had come a long way, achieving a stable and prosperous life while millions of others were still suffering. In response to this realization, Mr. Tinh made a significant decision: he sold his large home and moved into an apartment. The proceeds helped sustain his company through the pandemic and funded the creation of the Tony Foundation, his personal charitable initiative.

By early 2022, he made a lifelong commitment to philanthropy, dedicating his time and income to charitable work. As a result, Tony Foundation was officially transformed into **Be Better Foundation**, a legally recognized nonprofit social enterprise.

## FINANCIAL RESOURCES



At present, the Be Better Foundation is supported by a long-term commitment from our founder, Mr. Tran Van Tinh.

Mr. Tinh has pledged to dedicate 30% of his working time to the Foundation's activities and to contribute a minimum of 50% annual profits of IMM Group (his own enterprise) to ensure the sustainable operation and growth of our Foundation.

Since July 2025, IMM Group has officially transitioned into a non-profit organization, serving as a firm and legally binding commitment to funding the Be Better Foundation.

In addition, we are deeply grateful for the trust and financial support received from:

- Generous donors who are friends and partners of our founder.
- Contributors from volunteer communities across various social media platforms who have placed their trust in and supported our Foundation.

According to financial reports from 2022 to 2025, as of 31 December 2025:

- Be Better Foundation received over VND 8 billion in donations.
- (including: approximately VND 4.3 billion from our founder and IMM; our founder's friends and partners contributed approximately VND 2.2 billion; and the community contributed approximately VND 1.5 billion.)
- The total amount disbursed for social and charitable activities is VND 5.2 billion.

## HUMAN RESOURCES



The foundation's team consists of the Executive Board and a group of dedicated volunteers.

The Executive Board comprises independent volunteers, most of whom do not receive any salary or only a minimal stipend. They voluntarily support the foundation's operations in various areas, often contributing both their expertise and financial resources.

Be Better Foundation's volunteers are dedicated individuals who commit their time, knowledge, and effort to the foundation's activities. They include experienced professionals, university students, or even former grantees of the "Change the Future" scholarship. Despite their different backgrounds, they all share a strong commitment to humanitarian values and meaningful contributions.

## PRINCIPLES OF OPERATION

- ▶ Be Better Foundation ensures financial transparency through annual independent audits. Financial reports are publicly available to donors and contributors.
- ▶ The founders and volunteers do not receive salaries from the foundation.
- ▶ During sponsorship trips, volunteers and benefactors cover their own expenses without using foundation funds for personal costs.
- ▶ The foundation does not engage in charitable activities for self-promotion or the branding of any individual or organization.

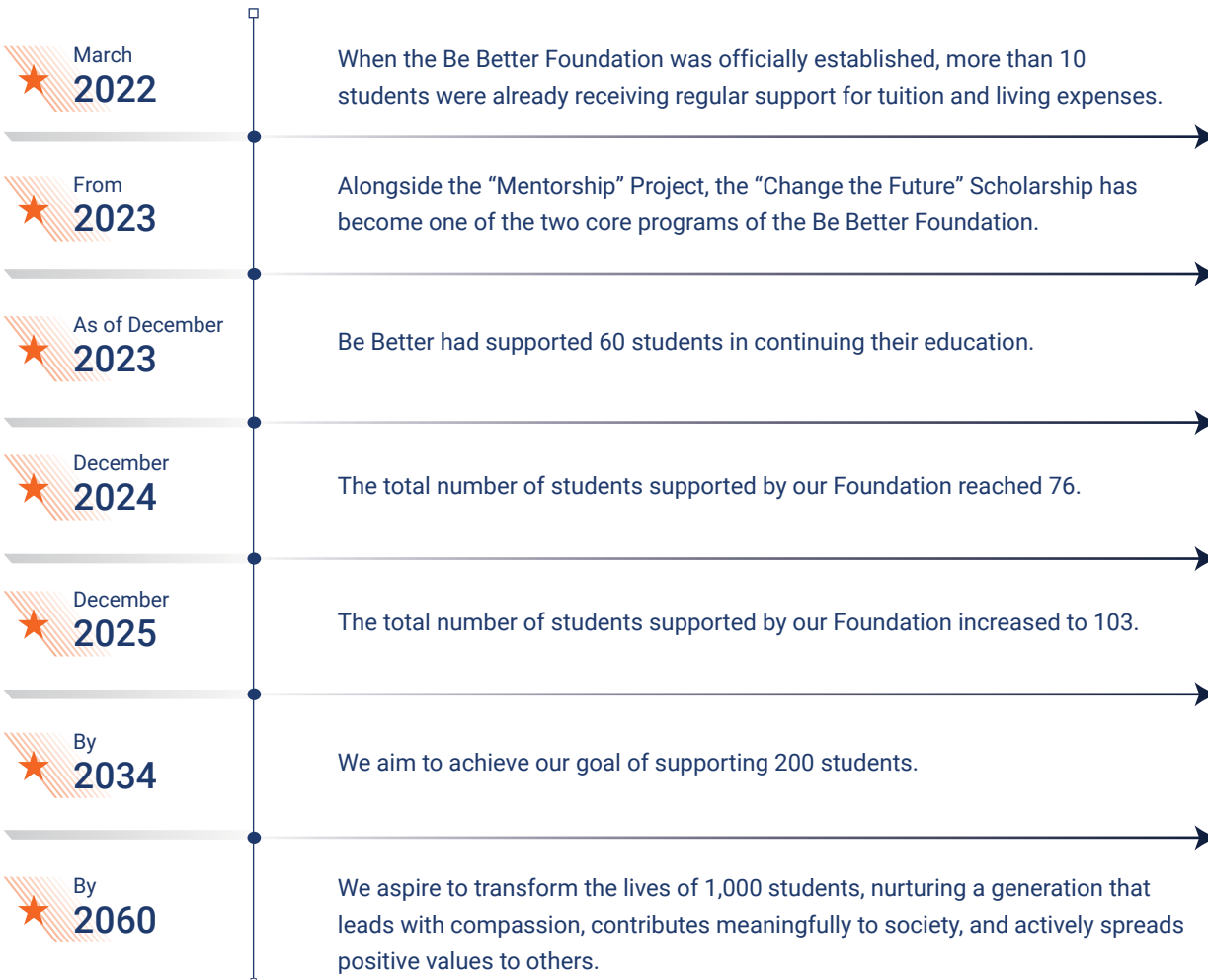

The "Change the Future" Scholarship Project is primarily a program providing limited financial aid for underprivileged students who are at risk of dropping out of school. This initiative has been in place since the establishment of the Be Better Foundation.

- ▶ Be Better aims to provide the opportunity to "Change the Future" for students facing economic and life difficulties. These students must also possess academic potential and good character, enabling them not only to help themselves and their families but also to spread positive values within their communities.

Most of the students considered for Be Better scholarships come from difficult circumstances, lacking emotional and financial support. Without assistance, they may have no choice but to halt their education. Among them are many who have lost one or both parents; some who were abandoned at a young age, now are struggling daily to survive while striving to continue their studies. Despite being only in their teens, many of them have already become the primary breadwinners for their families.

Each student has a different story, but they all share a common dream—to pursue education and succeed. Furthermore, they will undoubtedly become pillars of support for their families, serving as the driving force to break the cycle of poverty that has persisted for generations.



- To ensure scholarships are awarded to the right beneficiaries, the foundation implements a rigorous selection process that includes:

— A rigorous selection process consists of 4 stages:

- **Stage 1:** Be Better collaborates with secondary and high schools to provide information about the "Change the Future" scholarship. Students can apply by submitting through their schools or contacting the Foundation directly. The application dossier includes: a motivation letter, a letter of recommendation, and a confirmation letter of difficult living condition verified by the local authorities.
- **Stage 2:** Preliminary screening and testing include a 45-minute critical thinking test followed by a 15-minute direct interview.
- **Stage 3:** The judging panel convenes to review applications and score them based on five predefined criteria using a standardized scoring rubric.
- **Stage 4:** Verify living condition, announce results, and sign a commitment to confirm scholarship acceptance.

— Clear selection criteria are evaluated based on a scoring rubric.



## SCHOLARSHIP SELECTION PROCESS



### Scholarship Selection Criteria:

- **Criterion 1:** Level of difficulty.
  - **Criterion 2:** Level of academic effort.
  - **Criterion 3:** Level of clarity in determining future goals in study and occupation.
  - **Criterion 4:** Level of self-awareness, life perspective, and determination to overcome challenges to make change.
  - **Criterion 5:** Personal qualities that indicate the degree of positive thinking and mindset towards becoming a good person and contributing to society.
- Each criterion is scored on a scale of 1 to 10.
- The overall average score of the five criteria determines the type of scholarship awarded, with Criterion 1 having a weighting factor of 2.
- If any of the criteria 1, 2, or 5 receive the lowest score (1 point), the applicant is not eligible for a scholarship.

- To fulfill its commitment to sponsors and scholars, the foundation takes on the responsibility of guiding and supporting students as a mentor and guide, helping them stay on the right path for their future.

Therefore, the Foundation has established an annual scholarship renewal process to continuously monitor students' progress and ensure effective sponsorship.

**1** Each year, scholars must submit progress reports twice in an academic year - once per semester.

**2** Students complete two components: **SUBMITTING** a "Personal Development Report" and **ATTENDING** an interview with the Foundation.

**3** Scholarship renewal criteria:

- **Group 1:** By criterion on family and personal financial conditions.
- **Group 2:** By three criterion based on student performance and development:
  - a. Academic and work performance
  - b. Goal-oriented mindset
  - c. Attitude towards life

**4** Evaluation principles: Students are assessed based on their own past progress, not in comparison to others.

**5** Scholarship renewal decisions depend on students' current circumstances and development progress. The sponsor level may be increased, maintained, or reduced accordingly. In certain cases, students may lose their scholarships if they fail to uphold the foundation's principles.

#### Question 1: How do you perceive your family's current situation?

My family could have been just like any other, but I was born into a life of hardship. From birth, I was treated as an outcast, seen as a disgrace to my family lineage. My mother was a kind-hearted woman who once had a happy family, but a tragic incident changed her life forever—she was sexually assaulted, and I was the result of that trauma. Afterward, her husband left her, forcing her to raise me alone. Just when she thought things couldn't get worse, she was diagnosed with a severe illness. Due to financial difficulties, she couldn't afford early treatment, and by the time it was detected, it had reached its final stage. She passed away when I was in sixth grade. I was in school when a neighbor came to inform me that my mother had died. I couldn't believe it—just the day before, she had been smiling and giving me advice. After her passing, I had no family left. My maternal relatives rejected me, and as for my father, I had never even seen his face. I have been an orphan for nearly nine years, surviving and continuing my education thanks to social welfare funds. These support systems have been my motivation to keep going, study hard, and change my future. Honestly, my life story is long, and no amount of time would be enough to tell it all. Today, I can only summarize it briefly, but if given the opportunity, I would love to share more.

#### Question 2: How do you view your life? What responsibilities do you think you have?

I admit that I have felt resentment and questioned why my life isn't as normal as others'. However, before my mother passed away, she gave me many pieces of advice and guidance. Her words have helped me stay calm and reflect on the need to live well, contribute meaningfully to society, carry on her dreams and live for both our sakes. It's important to have the will to rise above any situation and maintain a spirit of progress to prove to society that I am a valuable citizen.

Thanks to the support and encouragement of many kind-hearted people, as well as my teachers who have created opportunities for me to learn and grow, I have found strength in those moments. There have been times when I wanted to give up on my studies due to extremely difficult circumstances. However, the material and emotional support from my teachers has motivated me to keep learning in order to overcome poverty and my unfortunate situation. I now understand the value of education. That's why I strive for a better future and hope to become an example for others facing hardships like mine.

#### Question 3: Do you want to change your family's situation? How would you like to change it?

I have always wanted to change my situation, to live a better and more meaningful life, and to be someone with wisdom who can affirm my value as a person. I want to fulfill the promise I made to my mother before she passed away. I know that the road ahead of me is long, with happiness to pursue, and that education is the most reliable and shortest path to achieving success. I am determined not to disappoint those who have helped me, and I hope to be in a position one day to support others facing hardships as well.

- How do you feel about your family situation? Do you feel any resentment towards your circumstances?

Dear Be Better Foundation,

I am Ha Tan Dat. My family has five members: my mother, stepfather, and two sisters. My father died when I was one due to heart disease. My mother remarried and had my younger sister. My mother, Le Thi Be Thi, is 54 years old. She has diabetes and muscle atrophy, which makes it difficult for her to move. She can only manage light work. She used to sell vegetables at Nguyen Van Thanh Market, but no longer can work due to illness. Our main source of income was from my mother, but now she can no longer earn a stable income. Now she stays at home, cooking meals for my stepfather, who works as a construction worker. If her health slightly improves, she sometimes helps out with construction work to earn a little extra money. My stepfather, Le Ngoc Diep, is 55 years old. Three years ago, he had a stomach ulcer, but his health is now stable. He works at various places and is now working in Tay Quoi. His income is just enough to support my younger sister, Ngoc Thu – a 8th grade student at Nguyen Van Thanh Secondary School. Due to old age and poor health, he earns a low wage and frequently has to take days off. My 27-year-old eldest sister, Ha Thuy Duyen, is now married, and works at a vegetable warehouse in Ho Chi Minh City, whose child is in the first grade. They are in good health. She manages to cover her rent and her child's tuition fees.

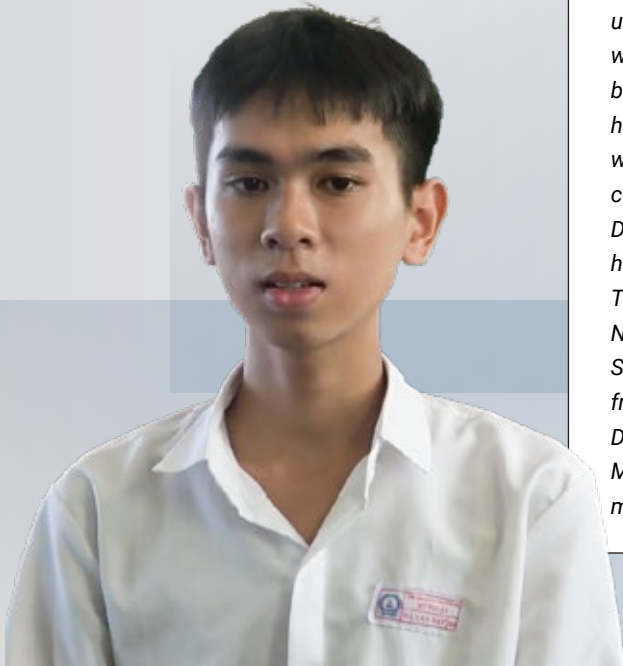
My younger sister, Le Ngoc Thu, is my family's last member. She is a 8th grade student at Nguyen Van Thanh Secondary School, and has been an excellent student for eight years.

I think we are in great difficulties and need of support. Before my mother fell ill, we had enough to eat and could afford to send both me and my sister to school. But things have become much harder. I do not resent my family as no one can choose to be born into wealth or happiness. In times of hardship, I have realized I need to work harder to lift my family out of poverty. It is not something to be ashamed of but allowed me to feel others' love and care, and given me opportunities, such as those offered by the Be Better Foundation. I feel grateful to have such a family.

Part 2:

If you do not receive support from the "Change the Future" scholarship, do you have any plan after graduating from high school? Please share the details of your plan.

Returning to school after a major setback in 5th grade that forced me to drop out of school to work for two years, I have planned my future. I used the money earned during that time for my tuition and took on part-time jobs to afford my daily meals. Now, in my final year of high school, I decided to choose IT as my major. I have been passionate about technology and computers since childhood. Now, I aspire to be admitted to the Ho Chi Minh City University of Information Technology or Can Tho University. I plan to take out a student loan under the government's financial aid policy for tuition fees. My eldest sister works near the university, so I could stay with her. If I attend Can Tho University, I could share a rental place with friends to reduce rental costs. I would then continue working part-time to cover living expenses.

**Question 1: How do you perceive your family's current situation?**

Dear Organization Board of the Be Better Foundation,

From my perspective, my family is currently facing extreme hardships. My parents have divorced, and my mother and I are living with my aunt. At times, my mother's income is very limited due to a lack of work, and there have been instances where she had to borrow money from neighbors just to cover our living expenses. Our struggles became even more challenging when my older brother was drafted into military service because our family could not afford to send him to school. This has made me feel very sad.

I have often questioned whether I should continue my education, fearing that I might become a burden on my mother, who is already over fifty years old. She frequently falls ill due to a past motorbike accident that left her with a fractured hand, limiting her ability to do strenuous work. She can only take on light labor, making it difficult for us to get by.

The hardships keep piling up. My father is no longer in contact with us, and I have no information about his whereabouts or occupation. He left my mother to shoulder the financial burden of raising me and my two brothers. My eldest brother, who is now married, has also separated from his wife, just like our parents. He works labor jobs in Saigon, yet he still struggles to make ends meet every month.

There have been many times when I saw my mother cry because she couldn't afford to pay my tuition fees. Recently, she had to borrow nearly VND 900,000 just to cover my school expenses. Sometimes, when I talk to her, she tells me she is getting old and feels helpless because she cannot provide for me as well as other parents do. Her eyes fill with tears when she says so. Seeing my mother's desperate tears has made me more mature and deeply aware of our family's dire situation.

Thuy was one of the early scholars of the "Change the Future" scholarship. At that time, the Be Better Foundation was still in its early days and lacked recognition.

Thuy's journey with Be Better began when she sent a plea for help during a time of extreme hardship. With tuition fees being an overwhelming burden on her family, she once considered taking high-interest loans just to continue her studies. The scholarship not only allowed her to stay in school but also gave her the reassurance that she was not alone in her pursuit of a brighter future.

By the end of 2023, she successfully completed her university studies and secured a full-time job as a Marketing Executive. In 2024, as she continues her journey with Be Better, she has taken on the role of an inspiring MC, sharing her own story to motivate other students.

The conclusion of the 2024 Mentorship program also marks a journey that came full circle within a year since Minh Thuy officially joined Be Better as an MC. Reflecting on her relentless efforts, the foundation cannot help but feel proud and deeply moved. Minh Thuy is not only a shining example of resilience in overcoming hardships but also a symbol of gratitude and the spirit of sharing. Thuy has proven that when one receives help, the most important thing is to turn it into motivation to rise above challenges and continue spreading those values to others.

The Mentorship Program is a program organized as a seminar to share the knowledge and experience of the predecessors with students, helping them to orient their thinking, equip them with the necessary and sufficient knowledge before preparing for life, and realize their dreams.

We connect high school students with mentors, including successful entrepreneurs and professionals from various fields to share those values.

- Share examples of overcoming difficulties and inspiring stories to help them see things more positively and be more motivated to strive to realize their own dreams.

**Mentorship is not just about giving away material things. We also give away our spiritual values, knowledge, and precious experiences.**

- Students have a healthy and beneficial playground to apply knowledge, practice skills, and develop thinking in the “Intellectual Person” competition.
- Students from disadvantaged backgrounds can participate in the “Intellectual Person” competition to challenge themselves, apply their skills and knowledge, and receive well-deserved prizes that can help them overcome the challenges they face in their studies and lives.
- Students know how to orient their future, learn how to think correctly and positively to face the challenges and difficulties in life.
- Students receive assessments and reflections on many aspects of life from professionals and experts. This knowledge helps them overcome the difficulties of choosing a major and career to make the most suitable decisions for the future.
- Students will have all their questions about future orientation and spiritual life answered.



## HOW IS THE MENTORSHIP PROGRAM ORGANIZED?



► To deliver the best message to the people who need it most, Mentorship is divided into two groups of programs:

(1) *Mentorship for students who receive the "Change the Future" scholarship.*

- In addition to funding tuition for students to continue going to school, the Be Better Foundation organizes a mentorship program to accompany them on their journey to build a foundation and develop themselves.
- Mentorship will be organized in the form of small seminars, conversations, sharing knowledge, skills, and experience to apply for jobs, solve difficulties in life.
- Above all, this mentorship program also helps the Be Better Foundation understand the students' lives and personal development journeys and strengthen the friendships of students in similar circumstances.

(2) *Mentorship for high school students*

- Target audience: all students from grade 9 to 12. Students can register voluntarily.
- For this group of students, Be Better Foundation wants to spread it more widely so that Mentorship is genuinely a meaningful program for the participating students.
- The mentors of Be Better Mentorship will inspire students with the right mindset and life values, empowering them to shape and own their future.

## The “Intellectual Person” competition



The competition consists of 2 parts corresponding to 2 question formats: individual debate and team debate.

At the end of each question, the speaker will share knowledge and experiences related to the question’s content. This will help students gain a more comprehensive perspective and a deeper understanding of an issue in life.

The program will end with the award ceremony of the “The Intellectual” competition, which includes three prizes for each question: one first, one-second, and one consolation prize (if any). The total value of the prizes is estimated to be up to 15 million VND.

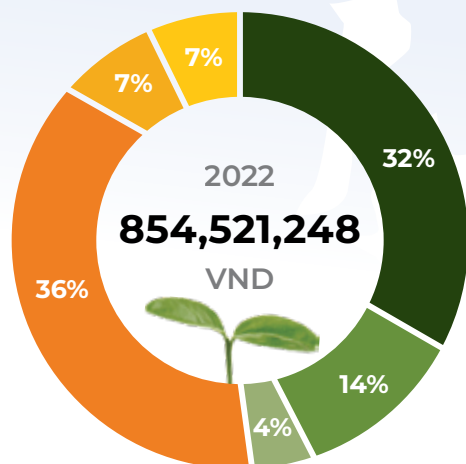
## ▶▶▶ OTHER SPONSORSHIP PROGRAMS IMPLEMENTED FROM 2022 TO 2023

In early 2022, the Be Better Foundation was established with the mission of helping underprivileged children access education. We embarked on our journey of giving with “Mindset-nurturing” campaigns, providing clothing, meals, and food supplies to schools, along with learning materials and scholarships for students from preschool to high school. Beyond easing some of their burdens, these campaigns aim to spread a message of perseverance in education despite hardships.

Deeply concerned about the lasting impact on the children we support, we realize that these projects are only temporary and serve as a stepping stone that sows the seeds of opportunity. Their true effectiveness depends on long-term and continuous support, ensuring that children receive assistance until their high school graduation. However, with limited financial resources, the Be Better Foundation is unable to fully provide for the thousands of children in our 2022 “Mindset-nurturing” campaigns.

By the end of 2022, after 10 months of official operation, the Foundation’s total funding, as recorded in the 2022 Audit Report, was VND 854,521,248.

In 2023, we continued parts of the “Mindset-nurturing” campaigns but gave priority to those whom Be Better could truly help to “change their future”. These are students in their final years of secondary or high school, facing extreme hardships but still demonstrating strong academic outcomes, motivation, and ambition to transform their lives. Without support, they would be forced to drop out, wasting their nine or twelve years of education. We firmly believe that, after so many years of schooling, education should open doors to a brighter future. We do not want to see these children abandon their studies, only to fall back into a cycle of labor, early marriage, and hardship. Without intervention, their children may face the same fate, trapped in an unbreakable cycle.

We want these students to have the opportunity to pursue vocational training, college or university education, depending on their abilities and dreams. After graduation, they will be able to do greater things, have a stable income, support their families, and even contribute to the development of their homeland as well. We firmly believe that changing the future of one child means changing the future of generations to come.

With this vision in mind, the “Change the Future” scholarship and the Mentorship program have become the two core initiatives of the Foundation.

By the end of 2023, the Foundation’s total funding, as recorded in the 2023 Audit Report, was VND 1,008,343,529.
