► INTRODUCTION

The end of 2025 marks the fourth year of Be Better Foundation's journey, with the mission to transform the lives of 1,000 students by 2060. Looking back over the past 365 days, Be Better is proud to have witnessed dreams ignited and our remarkable growth thanks to relentless dedication and effort.

Beyond the intangible values, 2025 also marks a strong breakthrough in both the scale and effectiveness of funding, reflected in the compelling figures:

- **Total funding for social initiatives: Exceeded VND 2.3 billion - a record increase of 227% compared with 2024 and 235% compared with 2023.**
- **"Change the Future" Scholarship: Disbursed VND 1.05 billion, representing a 186% increase compared with 2024, reaffirming our long-term commitment to supporting students throughout their academic journey.**
- **Mentorship Program: Invested VND 908 million, achieving remarkable growth of 216% compared with 2024 and 316% compared with 2023, with a strong focus on shaping mindset and life skills.**

NEW SCHOLARSHIPS



Out of a total of 68 scholarship applications for the 2024–2025 academic year, after the admission scholarship selection process, Be Better Foundation approved additional sponsorship for:

27 new students, including:

- 5 secondary and high school students
- 22 university/college students



SCHOLARSHIP RENEWAL



Conducted annually in July after the end of the academic year, the 2025 review assessed 49 sponsored students. Be Better Foundation evaluated their development as follows:

A. “Strong development” Level:

- 14 out of 49 students achieved the “Strong Development” level, demonstrating outstanding efforts in balancing both study and work, with results aligned with their personal goals.
- Among them, 4 students received an increase in scholarship support after the Foundation reassessed their personal and family financial circumstances.

B. “Good improvement, needs greater focus” Level:

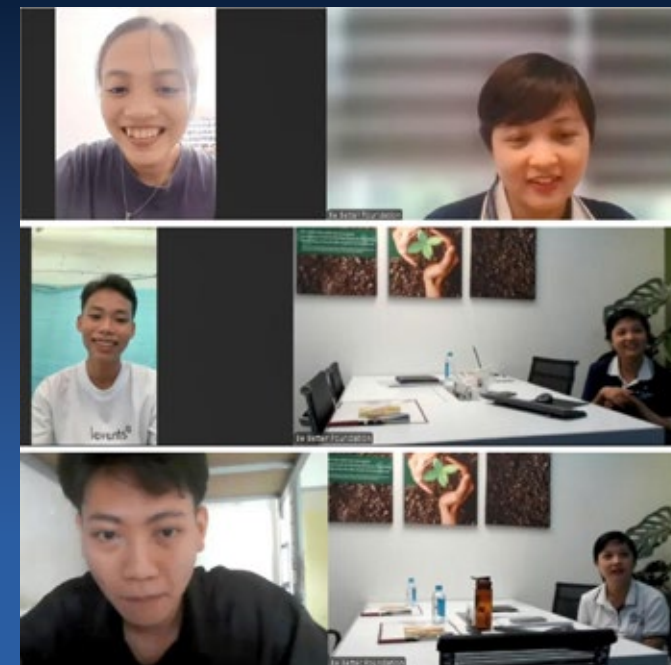
- 20 out of 49 students were classified as “Good improvement, needs greater focus.” These students continue to make strong efforts in both their studies and personal lives; however, their efforts have not yet produced the desired outcomes.
- 18 cases maintained their existing scholarship level, while 2 students received an increase in scholarship support after the Foundation reviewed their personal and family financial situations.

C. “Needs improvement” Level:

- 07 out of 49 students were assessed at the “Needs improvement” level.

D. “Warning” Level:

- 4 out of 49 students were placed at the “Warning” level, including 1 case where the level of financial support was reduced.
- In addition, the Foundation completed sponsorship for 2 out of the 49 students and discontinued sponsorship for another 2 students.

“CHANGE THE FUTURE” SCHOLARSHIP

By the end of 2025, the changes in the “Change the Future” Scholarship program are as follows:

- Increased sponsorship level: 6 students
- Scholarship maintained: 38 students
- Reduced sponsorship level: 1 student
- Sponsorship completed: 2 students
- Scholarship cancelled / sponsorship discontinued: 2 students
- New sponsorship recipients: 22 students

The total number of university/college students currently receiving sponsorship is 67, including:

- 27 full scholarships covering 100% of tuition fees
- 34 partial scholarships covering 50% of tuition fees
- 6 encouragement scholarships covering 25% of tuition fees

The total number of school students currently receiving sponsorship is 14.

The total number of students supported by the “Change the Future” Scholarship is **81**.

“Change the Future” Scholarship student reunion program

It has been three years since the establishment of the “Change the Future” Scholarship journey. The seeds once planted by the Foundation have now grown, matured, and become far more confident. The “Be Better Family” reunion, held in August 2025, marked the first time different generations of scholarship students had the opportunity to come together, meet one another, and share their journeys of striving to change their futures.

09 August 2025 – The first day of the reunion journey of the “Be Better Family” officially began with a special Mentorship program titled “Success & Virtue.” This was a journey for students to gain a deeper understanding of the four core pillars: Body – Mind – Wisdom – Virtue, to learn how to take responsibility for their own lives, and to equip themselves with personal financial knowledge to manage spending and savings effectively.

10 August 2025 – On the second day of the reunion journey, we visited the Memorial Site of Former Prime Minister Vo Van Kiet and organized a Teambuilding activity – Connecting with Compassion.

This was truly a time for the Be Better family to connect: to listen, to share, and to understand one another more deeply. Many stories were shared, from studies and work to family concerns and the personal challenges each student has faced. Through these stories, we witnessed the seeds gradually breaking through the soil and growing stronger. Faces that were once shy and hesitant now stood confidently before everyone, sharing their personal journeys with clear and inspiring voices. In those moments, we witnessed the power of opportunity. We saw the trust placed by the Foundation beginning to bear fruit, and Be Better is proud to accompany these students on their journey.

STUDENT: **BUI THI BICH THUY**

Among the seven students whom the Be Better Foundation has accompanied and successfully supported, 2025 saw two remarkable cases: the students themselves requested to conclude their scholarships after becoming strong enough to stand on their own, take responsibility for their studies, and pursue their personal development independently. Beyond marking personal growth, they voluntarily forfeited their scholarships so other students in greater need could receive support. To Be Better Foundation, this is not merely a milestone but a priceless gift in the journey of giving. When an opportunity is offered at the right moment, it not only changes one life but also plants the seed of compassion, allowing kindness to continue, spread, and grow in the most natural way.

Bui Thi Bich Thuy is a student majoring in English Linguistics at Dong Thap University. Her circumstances have been particularly difficult. She lost both of her parents at a very young age, leaving only her and her older brother. Because of financial hardship, her brother had to abandon his studies and move away to work as a factory worker. He entrusted Thuy to the care of their uncle and aunt in their hometown. When Thuy was about to enter university, her family situation remained unchanged. She continued to rely on her relatives for support, while her brother still struggled without a stable future in sight. At that time, the Foundation met her as if by fortunate destiny and officially accompanied her throughout 1.5 years of university, providing a full scholarship covering 100% of her tuition fees for three semesters, with a total sponsorship amount of VND 22,060,000.

At the beginning of 2025, the Foundation received an email from Bich Thuy stating: “My parents have both passed away, and my older brother and I inherited four plots of land, but previously they did not have proper legal documentation. With the support of my uncle (my grandmother’s younger brother), the land documentation has now been completed, and the land has been sold. I plan to use this amount to support my education and living expenses so that I can continue pursuing my academic goals. Additionally, I would like to return the scholarship I received from the Foundation so that it may be given to other students facing greater difficulties, allowing them the opportunity to strive forward in life as the Foundation once supported me.”

This was not only a great joy in the lives of Thuy and her brother, but also a profound source of pride for Be Better Foundation. We are proud to have accompanied and supported a young girl who is deeply responsible for her own life, honest, and appreciative of what she has. Most importantly, we are proud of Bích Thuy’s spirit of sharing, her understanding of “having enough” and her willingness to give back to others.

STUDENT: **NGUYEN THI MONG AN BINH**

An Binh was born into a near-poor household in Vinh Long. When she was six years old, her parents divorced. Her mother took her and her sister to live with their grandmother. A few years later, her mother remarried and moved away, leaving An Binh and her younger sister in their grandmother's care. All living expenses depended on their grandmother collecting recyclable scrap, earning only about VND 100,000 (around USD 3.81) per day. Her younger sister, despite being an excellent student, had to drop out of school after the fourth grade because the family could no longer afford her education. An Binh has not met her father for more than 12 years, although he still quietly supported his children. An Binh decided to apply to a university in Ho Chi Minh City, both to pursue her dreams and to be closer to her father. Tragically, only a few months after their reunion, her father suddenly passed away.

She is currently studying Social Work at Ho Chi Minh City University of Education. While attending university, she works part-time and participates in academic research. There are days when she must push herself to balance classes, work, and research projects. Throughout her time receiving the “Change the Future” scholarship, An Binh has made tireless efforts to balance her studies, part-time work, scientific research, and active participation in school activities.

In July 2025, the Foundation received a heartfelt letter from her:

“I would like to stop receiving financial support because my life has now become more stable. I would never claim to fully understand, but I do comprehend part of the thoughts and challenges the Foundation faces. Therefore, I wish to only receive what I truly need and pass the rest on to another student who is in greater hardship.”

We respect her deeply responsible and mature decision. For An Binh, education has not only been a path to change her own destiny, but also a way to pursue her dream of becoming a psychological therapist to support the small, wounded, and lost souls around her. Her story is one of the most beautiful one that we have had the honor of witnessing.

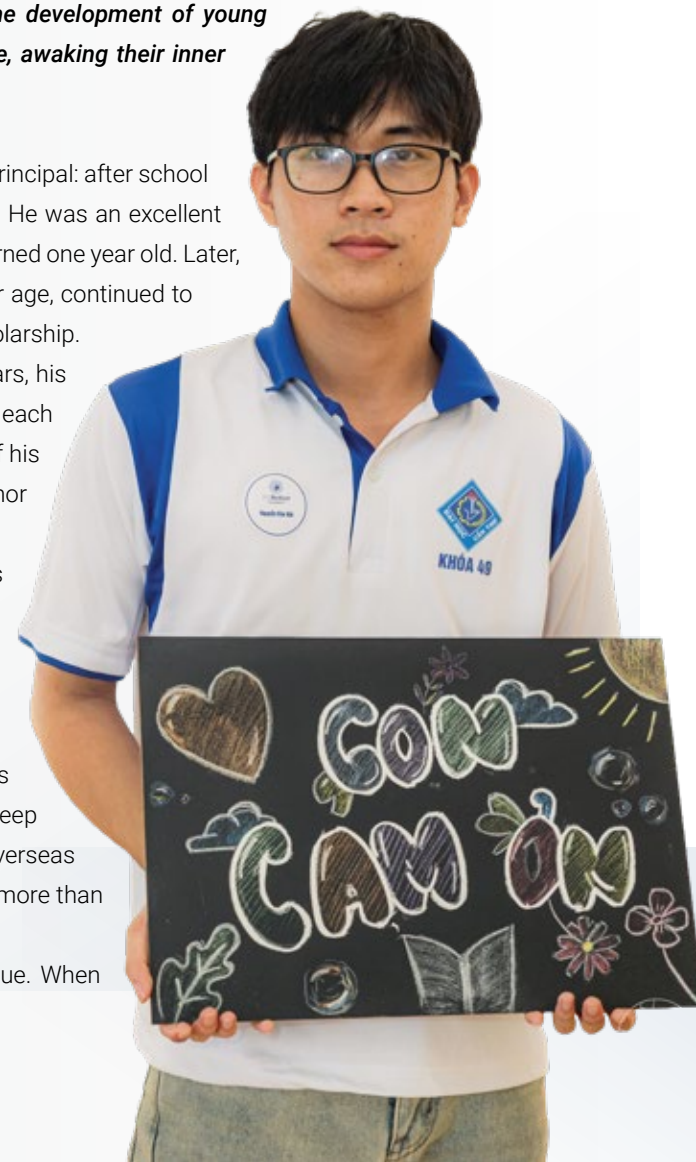
STUDENT: **NGUYEN VAN HAI**

On the journey of accompanying students facing difficult circumstances, we are always grateful for the opportunity to witness the development of young individuals who are resilient, determined, and truly remarkable. We are grateful to be able to offer timely support to the right people, awaking their inner strength and igniting their dreams rather than letting them be buried under the hardships of poverty.

From the very first days of meeting Hải, we were impressed by his calm and quiet demeanor, as well as by a story shared by the school principal: after school each day, he would quietly sit alone behind the house, speaking to no one. At that time, Hai was at an important crossroad in his life. He was an excellent student with a strong desire to pursue higher education, yet his family circumstances did not allow it. His mother left when he had just turned one year old. Later, his father started a new family and could no longer care for him. Hai grew up in the care of his elderly grandparents, who, despite their age, continued to work tirelessly with what little strength they had to support his schooling. The “Change the Future” Scholarship awarded Hai a full scholarship. We chose to accompany him because we believed that this young boy possessed tremendous inner strength. Over more than two years, his journey has proven that investing in Hai’s education was entirely worthwhile. He has consistently achieved outstanding academic results each semester, maintaining an excellent GPA and receiving multiple academic encouragement scholarships from the university. By the end of his second year of university (July 2025), we were extremely happy and proud to receive news from Hai that he had been honored on the Honor Roll of Can Tho University.

During our regular conversations, as we listened to Hai’s choices regarding his academic path and life decisions, we really admired his persistent determination to rise above adversity. Above all, we deeply respect the profound love and gratitude he holds for his grandparents who raised him and shaped the person he has become. Most of the Foundation’s students take part-time jobs to cover their living expenses but Hai chose a different path: dedicating all his time and energy to his studies, with the goal of earning academic scholarships from the university to support his living costs. He once shared that when he received his first scholarship, the first thing he did was buy a special meal for his grandparents to enjoy together. From that scholarship money, he also contributed to his grandfather’s medical expenses. During one semester, his grandfather suffered a stroke and was unable to walk; Hai cared for him while continuing to keep up with his studies. After a long journey with various outstanding achievements, Hai was offered the opportunity to participate in an overseas student exchange program. However, he declined the opportunity, because at that moment, his grandparents needed him by their side more than ever.

Witnessing Hai’s inspiring journey of resilience strengthens our belief in the path the Foundation has chosen and continues to pursue. When opportunities are given, these students always prove themselves worthy of them.

STUDENT: **HA TAN DAT**

Tan Dat once stood on the verge of leaving the path of education. Being born into a family facing severe financial hardship, he had to drop out of school in the eighth grade to work as a factory worker to support his family. Experiencing the hardships of labor at such a young age made Dat understand more than ever the value of knowledge. Many sleepless nights of reflection eventually drove him to return to school, even though the road ahead remained full of challenges. To afford meals and cover his high school expenses, Dat worked as a security guard for a public restroom at the local market. The work was arduous, but he was cared and supported by his teachers, friends, and the vendors at the market. However, as he approached the end of twelfth grade, Dat once again faced the possibility of giving up his studies, as the cost of university tuition was far beyond his means.

In a handwritten letter sent to the Be Better Foundation, he shared: “I dream of becoming a programmer to create products that are useful for society. But the idea of going to university worried me as I don’t know how I can pay for my further education.”

The “Change the Future” Scholarship became the support that allowed Dat to continue pursuing that dream. With a full scholarship, he officially became a Computer Science student at Can Tho University in 2024. Throughout his first year of university, Dat worked part-time to support his living expenses while maintaining an excellent GPA, earning an academic encouragement scholarship from the university. He also took on the role of class secretary and actively participated in Youth Union and Student Association activities. There were times when he had to care for his seriously ill mother while continuing to study and work at the same time. At one point, exhaustion forced him to be hospitalized, yet Dat never allowed himself to give up. During a regular meeting with the Foundation, he shared: “I want to give my absolute best and see where persistent effort can take me.”

The journey of Ha Tan Dat reminds us that when opportunities are offered at the right moment, determined young people will move forward with perseverance and dignity. That is the reason why Be Better Foundation believes in the path we have chosen: providing opportunities so that dreams can continue to live.



- In 2025, Be Better Foundation was proud to organize the largest number of Mentorship programs in our history:
 - 15 programs conducted at 15 secondary and high schools
 - A total of 3,840 students participated
- In addition, the Foundation successfully organized the program “Dad, help me” for 1,400 students at Vo Van Kiet High School, aimed at raising awareness and preventing online scams and online kidnapping threats, which have become increasingly complex in recent times.

At the beginning of 2025, Be Better Foundation continued to improve and update the Mentorship program to enhance the experience and strengthen connections for students.

- For the first time, the “A person of wisdom” competition included teachers as advisors. Teachers not only provided academic guidance but also engaged in discussions and reflections with students on the program’s themes, fostering an open, two-way learning environment rich in mentorship.
- In addition to the public speaking competition, the program introduced a team-based debate segment, helping students develop critical thinking, listening skills, and the ability to defend their viewpoints respectfully.
- Furthermore, with the goal of building a connection circle among the Be Better Foundation – students – teachers – and parents, we expanded participant base by inviting parents to accompany their children during Mentorship sessions.



Throughout the 15 Mentorship programs in 2025, the Be Better Foundation continuously refined both the content and implementation methods to make the program more relatable to students, addressing the genuine concerns of their age group. Through this process, the program helps students better understand themselves and become more prepared in terms of mindset and awareness for the journey ahead.

As a response to these efforts, the sincere reflections shared by students after the program have become the clearest evidence of the impact of Mentorship:

- “Mentorship does not give me empty advice; instead, it guides me through real-life stories of mentors... From today, I know how to ask questions, plan small goals for each study week, and no longer see the future as something distant and unreachable.”
- A thoughtless decision can cost us our entire youth. But I also understand that there is always a chance to start again if we do not give up.”
- “The future isn’t handed out like a gift. It’s something we sculpt for ourselves. And I am ready to begin from today.”

Nguyen Hoang Phi Long once shared a sentence that we will likely remember for a very long time:

What truly matters is how we choose to accompany them—how we share real stories, pass on knowledge, and nurture belief. Those choices ultimately determine whether they will have the courage to open their hearts, to receive these lessons, and to grow from them.

At the end of the program, a profoundly special moment brought stillness to the entire room, touching our hearts: A 12th-grade student named Anh Duong stepped onto the stage. She is an orphan who is petite and physically different from her peers. Her small hands trembled as they held the microphone. Her eyes tinged with red, yet her words were clear, thoughtful, and powerful: "When you compare yourself to others, you may feel lacking; but remember, someone else is dreaming of having your life. What I want to tell everyone is that sometimes when we feel inadequate, not smart enough, or in our dark times, just keep living, as things will get better. We are already more fortunate than so many others."

That moment was no longer a normal speech but gave everybody a fresh heart. In the audience, parents blinked away tears, some turning away to quietly wipe their eyes. The teachers, usually composed and solemn, could not hide their emotions when their student dared to face her struggles and speak from the heart. Even members of the Foundation, who had traveled far and met many students, also found themselves tearful and choked with emotion as they watched that small figure speak to hundreds.

It is often believed that beauty must be visible, radiant, and prominent to shine. However, there is a kind of beauty that cannot be measured by appearance. The beauty of someone can be seen by the way they choose to believe in kindness, even when life is unkind. As Roald Dahl once said, "A person who has good thoughts cannot ever be ugly." Anh Duong's beauty cannot be measured by her figure or features but in her wholeness of mind, in choosing not to complain, not to give up, but to share the light she carries.

The Foundation's journey has never been limited to a single conversation or a few words of advice. What we truly hope to plant in the hearts of these students is the belief that their youth deserves to be valued and accompanied. Perhaps the words shared today are not powerful enough to immediately transform their lives. But someday, when they face difficulties or challenges, a fragment of today's memory may return like a small spark of light, which is enough to illuminate the way forward and remind them that their future is still wide open.



The 72-Hour Challenge “From me to others” was launched to create a reflective space after the Mentorship sessions, where students can pause and revisit what they have experienced and contemplated, and begin transforming those reflections into actions in their daily lives. Rather than stopping at momentary emotions, the challenge encourages students to apply the lessons drawn from Mentorship to real life: in their studies, within their families, and in the way they face themselves.

Since its official launch in March 2025, Be Better Foundation has received many sincere and thoughtful submissions from students. These are not elaborately polished essays, but honest reflections where students sit down for the first time to engage in a dialogue with themselves about values, personal responsibility, and the path ahead. These writings reveal a quiet yet meaningful shift: students begin to ask questions, to reflect more deeply, and to become more conscious of their choices.

The greatest value that “From me to others” aims to cultivate does not lie in prizes or rankings, but in the moment when students dare to face themselves—dare to write about unfinished thoughts, fears, aspirations, and even the smallest personal commitments. When a student begins to reflect on themselves, believe more in their own potential, and patiently take one step at a time, that itself is already a meaningful beginning.

Be Better Foundation believes that through these simple stories, seeds of belief and responsibility have been quietly planted. They may not yet be strong enough to create immediate transformation, but they are strong enough for students to carry with them on their journey of growth—serving as a reminder that every lasting change begins with awareness and the choice to act with integrity.

II. OBJECTIVES, PRINCIPLES AND OPERATION METHODS
1. Social, environmental goals and solutions.
a. Corporate social and environmental goals

- Helping children with extremely difficult circumstances to go to school, including children from extremely poor families who have the will, ability to learn, dreams and ambitions to change their family life in the future.

- Support from elementary school students to alumnus and the goal is that all children from this background get the highest possible education, up to university graduates with stable careers. Equip them with the necessary skills, knowledge and experience for the future through the "mentorship" program ("mentorship" is a training program applied to high school students and poor students).

- Equip them with knowledge, skills and experience to enter life, to be successful and to live a meaningful and useful life for society in the future. This is done through seminars, sharing sessions, guidance and orientation for children with necessary and useful knowledge in their work and in their future lives.

- Helping lonely elderly people with special circumstances such as: No children to be taken care of, no stable place to live, or unsafe accommodation.

b. Principles of organization and operation of the Company

- The Company will receive funding from individuals and organizations who wish to contribute to serve social purposes related to disadvantaged pupils and alumnus and the lonely elderly.

- After deducting the Company expense such as salary, tax, administrative expenses, etc. The Company commits to spend 100% of the profit earned to organize courses, trainings, seminars, career building projects, propagating and disseminating knowledge of poor and studious students.

- Through activities of organizing short-term training courses, improving professional knowledge, sharing experiences, organizing seminars, building projects to disseminate knowledge and information, the company hopes to want to contribute to improving knowledge for students with difficult circumstances.

- Cooperate with universities to award scholarships to encourage the spirit of learning, partially support study costs for students with difficult and studious circumstances.

- The main beneficiaries are students with difficult circumstances and studious. In addition, the company will also help the elderly people living alone with special circumstances.

- If for some reason it is not possible to return the balance of donations and aid to individuals and organizations that have contributed to the Company, the Company commits to transfer this balance to social and charity funds, or other social enterprises with the same goal.

III. ACCOUNTING REGIME, ACCOUNTING PERIOD AND REPORTING CURRENCY
1. Applicable accounting system

The Company applies the accounting system promulgated according to Circular 41/2022/TT-BTC issued on July 5, 2022 by the Ministry of Finance.

2. Fiscal year

The annual accounting period begins on January 1 and ends on December 31 of each year

3. Accounting currency

The entity uses Vietnam Dong (VND) in accounting and reporting

IV. APPLICABLE ACCOUNTING POLICIES
1. Cash and cash equivalents

Cash includes currencies (Vietnamese currency, foreign currencies) and current deposits at the bank or state treasury at the unit.

Accounting for cash must use the unique currency unit, which is Vietnam Dong. Transactions arising in foreign currencies must be converted into Vietnam Dong for recording in accounting books.

- When a cash fund is entered or deposited into an account at the Bank in a foreign currency, the foreign currency must be converted into Vietnam dong at the exchange rate prescribed at the time of arising economic operations for recording in the accounting books;

- When withdrawing foreign currency from the Bank, the foreign currency shall be converted into Vietnam Dong at the exchange rate reflected in the accounting books by one of two methods: weighted average; Specific identification price. Foreign currencies must be managed in detail by each currency.

2. Receivables

All receivables must be tracked in detail according to each receivable content, for each collector, each time to be paid, and must closely monitor, regularly inspect and urge debt recovery, avoid capital misappropriation.

For debt customers with whom the unit has regular transactions, payments or has a large debt balance, at the end of the accounting period, it is necessary to make a debt statement, compare, check, confirm the debt and have a plan timely recovery, avoiding the situation of stagnation and appropriation of capital.

3. Inventories

The company's inventory includes goods and tools used for charity activities.
In case of selling inventory, the original cost of sold inventory is recognized as an expense in the period in accordance with revenue.

In case the difference is detected, the cause must be determined and immediately reported to the chief accountant or in charge of accounting and the board of directors for timely handling measures.

4. Payables and other payables

5. Taxes and payable to state budget

6. Capital contribution

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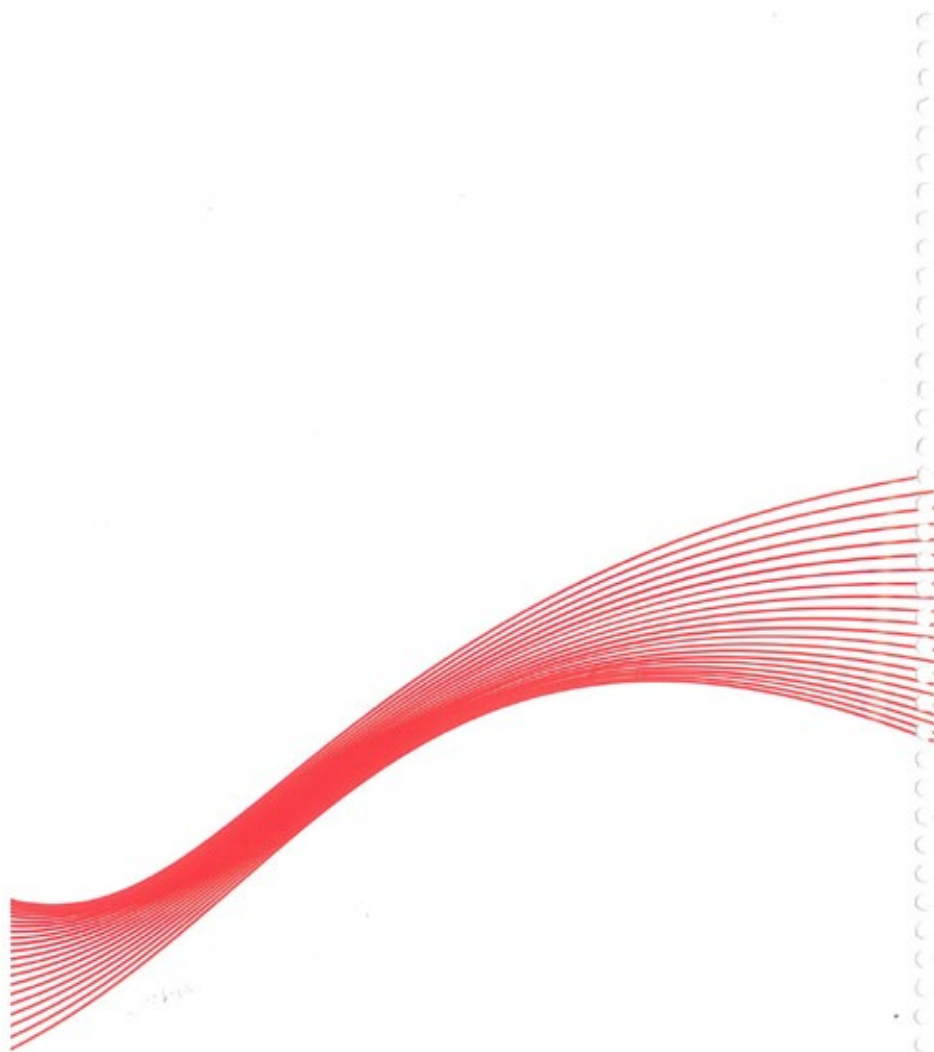

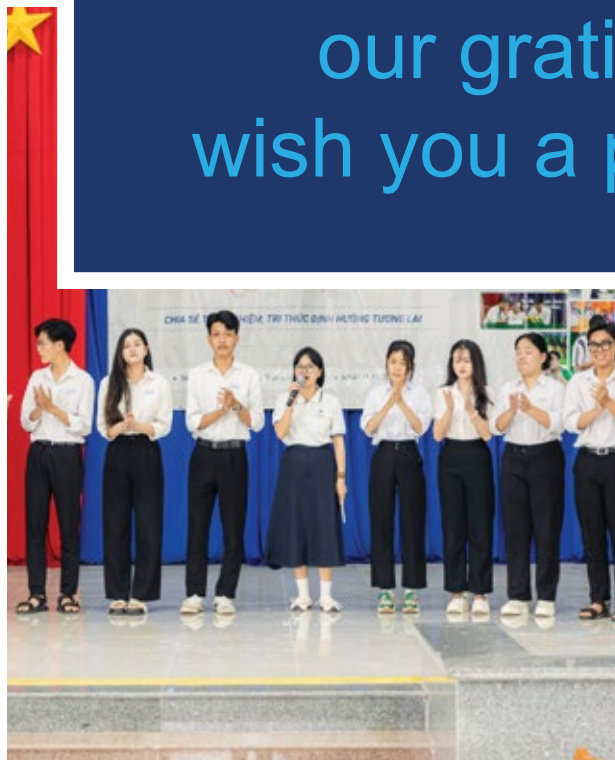
